## Person Eligible for the Alcohol Ignition Interlock Device Program

This form is for individuals who are subject to a penalty prohibiting them from putting into operation, acquiring, renting, leasing or registering a road vehicle (ROA penalty) and who wish to have an exemption that would allow them to put into operation, acquire, lease and register a road vehicle or vehicles. To submit an application, please bring this duly completed form to an SAAQ service centre.

### Required supporting documents

Service agreement for the leasing of an alcohol ignition interlock device for each vehicle referred to in the application. If the applicant holds a licence that authorizes him or her to drive a vehicle equipped with an alcohol ignition interlock device, the service agreement is not required.

**IMPORTANT:** This exemption will be cancelled after being granted if any of the following offences are entered on the offender's record: unpaid fine, uninsured accident or failure to provide proof of insurance when required to do so. It may also be cancelled if the offender's licence is suspended, revoked or cancelled, or if vehicle registration is not paid by the deadline.
