



For your safety and the safety of others, you are required to undergo a medical assessment:

- following certain changes in your state of health;
- at age 80 and every two years thereafter.

Depending on the state of your health, these checkups could be required more frequently.



What do you need to do?

- 1 Undergo a medical assessment
 Consult a physician or a specialized nurse practitioner to have the Report on a Person's State of Health Driver's Licence that you received filled out. Note that you will usually have to pay a fee for this service.
- 2 Send us the report
 Send us the report by the prescribed deadline for your driver's licence to remain valid.
- (3) Wait for the decision

 After our analysis, a decision will be rendered and sent to you in writing.

 In the meantime, your driver's licence will remain valid.



Rest assured, very few drivers have their licence withdrawn after a medical assessment. However, some may be subject to certain conditions, such as having to wear glasses when driving.
