



Why a Medical Assessment?

Québec 



For their own safety and that of others, all drivers are required to undergo a medical assessment:

- > following certain changes in their state of health;
- > six months prior to their 75th and 80th birthdays;
- > every two years thereafter.

Depending on your medical condition, these verifications could be required more frequently.



Medical assessment

- ① You must consult a physician or an appropriate health professional recognized in Canada and have him or her fill out and sign the medical examination reports you have received (the *Medical Examination Report* and *Eye Examination Report* forms). You will have to pay the required fees, which are not refundable.
- ② You must send us the medical examination reports within 90 days. This deadline must be respected in order for your driver's licence to remain valid. We will then render a decision and send it to you in writing.



Your licence will remain valid until you receive the decision.

Rest assured: very few drivers have their licence withdrawn after a medical assessment. However, some will have to comply with such conditions as the obligation to wear glasses when driving. If this is the case for you, you are required to comply with these conditions at all times when operating a vehicle.
